

Six-Team “Modified Seeded” Playoff Format

- Establish seeding during games of the regular season
- Top seeded team will always be the “Home Team”

Day Leagues 1, 2, 6 & 7 version played on three fields over four weeks

Week 1	#1 Seed vs #6 Seed	#2 Seed vs #5 Seed	#3 Seed vs #4 Seed
Week 2	#2 Seed vs #4 Seed	#3 Seed vs #6 Seed	#1 Seed vs #5 Seed
Week 3	#3 Seed vs #5 Seed	#1 Seed vs #4 Seed	#2 Seed vs #6 Seed

Teams with 2 or more losses are eliminated after week 3. You would now have 7 Win-Loss possibilities.

7 Possible Standings after week 3:

- #1 2-1, 2-1, 2-1, 1-2, 1-2, 1-2:
The two lowest seeded 2-1 teams play on week 4 with the winner playing the highest seeded 2-1 team for the championship. (1 game on week 4)
- #2 3-0, 2-1, 2-1, 2-1, 0-3, 0-3:
The two highest seeded 2-1 teams play on Week 4 with the winner playing the 3-0 team for the championship (1 game on week 4)
- #3 3-0, 3-0, 3-0, 0-3, 0-3, 0-3:
The two lowest seeded 3-0 teams play on week 4 with the winner playing the highest seeded 3-0 team for the championship (1 game on week 4)
- #4 3-0, 2-1, 2-1, 1-2, 1-2, 0-3:
The two 2-1 seeded teams play on week 4 with the winner to play the 3-0 team for the championship (1 game week 4)
- #5 3-0, 3-0, 1-2, 1-2, 1-2, 0-3:
The two 3-0 teams play the championship.
- #6 3-0, 3-0, 2-1, 1-2, 1-2, 0-3:
Lowest seeded 3-0 team plays the 2-1 team on week 4, with the winner advancing to play the highest seeded 3-0 team for the championship (1 game week 4)
- #7 2-1, 2-1, 2-1, 2-1, 1-2, 0-3:
Highest seeded 2-1 vs lowest seeded 2-1 team and the other two 2-1 teams play on week 4. Winners advance to the championship game. (2 games week 4)

Note: The above scenarios allow teams to play consolation games on week 4 if teams want to.

With the above format, all teams play at least 3 more games. No teams have a bye during the first 3-weeks of playoffs and no teams are eliminated in the 1st or 2nd week of playoffs. All scenarios may not be true double elimination but still give the final teams at least 4 games.
